Peter was the Rector of Saint Mary's Newton, MA for 17 years which happened to be the town where he was raised. He served on a wide range of Diocesan Commissions including president of the Standing Committee.

He first met Abbie, his wife, in San Diego while a consultant to the Navy's Chaplain Corps. They moved to Berkeley, California in 1977 when Peter entered seminary and Abbie continued as a flight attendant.
