Vestry Actions, July, 2018 By Dual Macintyre, Clerk of the Vestry

A summary of the actions taken by the Vestry at its July 19, 2018 meeting.

Treasurer's report: Frank Robinson

The financial results for June were reviewed. The Treasurer announced that the Lighthouse School has decided to cease its license agreement after the coming school year. He also noted the audit of the church's financials for 2017 was completed earlier and that Peter Lamb, the CPA who conducted the review, agreed that the financial reports and footnotes for the 2017 year should be dated June 30, 2018 in order to capture all the changes during the last six months. A motion was made, seconded and voted unanimously to approve the Treasurer's report.

Buildings and Grounds: Luke Thornewill

Luke summarized the recently completed restoration work on the tower. We expect the final report from Brian Pfeiffer soon and anticipate it will recommend additional work on the West wall around the Tiffany windows.

Priest-in-Charge Observations and Thoughts: Max Wolf

Max commented on the Fair and how impressed he was with the large number of children who had a wonderful time. He also thanked the many, many people who had work so long and so hard to make the Fair such a success. He was happy to see the enthusiasm, joy and spirit shown by those who made the Fair happen and those who participated in the activities.

St. Paul's Fair: Dual Macintyre

The preliminary results show the Fair will bring in more than \$27,000 this year, which is remarkable since there were fewer contributions to Gift Chalet and Hodge Podge this year than in earlier years. The Vestry voted to commend Sharon Robinson for her tireless efforts throughout the year to make the Fair happen.

Church website: Martin McKerrow

Martin reported that he had revised many sections of the website recently and invited Vestry members to provide their feedback to him. He said that many of the photographs were dated and that new ones showing people at church activities were needed. To that end, he has asked Beverly Hall to take photographs at the next baptism so they can be added to the site.

Warden's reports: Lou Gennaro and Pam Goddard

Lou said that Sheila Daume needs help selling the raffle tickets and he asked Vestry members to volunteer for a 2 hour shift.

Lou talked about the number of volunteers needed to put on events and do the work of the vital church committees. As frequently happens, a few people do a major portion of the work and that leads to individual burnout.

Lou announced the second Ship's Inn Dinner this year will be held in late September.
