# FATHER MAX, OUR 33<sup>RD</sup> RECTOR!



- At its September meeting, the Vestry voted unanimously to adopt the Discernment Committee's recommendation to call Father Max Wolf as our new Rector.
- Bishop Alan Gates affirmed our selection. He shared his joy with these words: "It gladdens my heart to hear this good news!"
- Max joined St. Paul's in 2018 as Priest-In-Charge and came to the island with his wife, Olly.

### FROM FATHER MAX

Olly and I love Nantucket and our island community, and we feel so blessed to be called here to serve. St. Paul's Church has long had a commitment to open table fellowship, where people of all backgrounds and walks of life are invited to receive Holy Communion, not just members only. Long known for our gracious hospitality, parishioners are also now more than ever working together to meet local needs. I also find quite rewarding and enlightening my affiliation with Community Foundation for Nantucket, Nantucket Cottage Hospital, Nantucket Interfaith Council and Fairwinds Counseling Center. We find Nantucket to be such a caring community.

- Being unique in our way of embracing families no matter how constituted and by providing broad spiritual, pastoral and educational support and hope.
- Growing our numbers, managing our finances, sustaining our campus and devoting creative efforts to stewardship.

#### MEET OUR NEW INTERN

- At its September meeting, the Vestry approved Father Max's request to retain Lt. Jonathan Smith, US Navy Reserve, as an intern at St. Paul's. This is part of his training to become a Navy Chaplain and to be ordained as an Episcopal priest.
- Jonathan is working toward his master's degree at Harvard Divinity School. The Navy requests that its Chaplains receive supervised parish experience.
- Jonathan has a background in communications and website design—he once worked as a news producer at MTV, the music video channel! —and joins us with his dog Linus.

### PARISH NEWS

- Members of the **Mission Committee**, in partnership with the Community Foundation for Nantucket and the Nantucket Catering Company, safely distributed more than **600 free meals** in May and June to island families facing hardship. The Committee is now considering how it might expand this service jointly with our **Fellowship Committee** by safely preparing and distributing more meals as the pandemic disrupts employment and earnings of more island families.
- Laundry Love provides free monthly washing and drying to island residents who need financial help to do their family's laundry. The Committee assisted more than 80 families with the cost of their laundry in the first quarter of 2020 and, since then, has been mailing 36 laundry cards monthly to its regular patrons (216 cards as of the end of September).

- Committee members continue to provide \$50 gift cards from restaurants and Stop & Shop in support of the 26 staff members at **Fairwinds Counseling Center**.
- St. Paul's is a member, and Father Max is the new president, of the Nantucket Interfaith Council. The Council operates the **Nantucket Food, Fuel and Rental Assistance** program. The Committee donates funds to NFFRA, and its members volunteer to assist with the distribution of goods by the pantry.

#### FINANCES

- St. Paul's is blessed to be in a strong financial position with good liquidity.
- *Total Income* through August 31<sup>st</sup> was \$405,000--about 10% more than budgeted.
- Factors driving income have been steady pledge payments, additional unrestricted gifts, special offerings and mission donations (an unbudgeted category).
- Thank you! Your continuing support will allow us to fund ongoing operations and extend community outreach in an uncertain outlook for the pandemic and the economy.
- Our July unFAIR, which replaced our cancelled Summer Fair, helped offset lost fundraising income through the sale and curbside pickup of 176 delicious lobster and chicken dinners.
- *Total Expenses* were 4% below budget, thanks to prudent spending adjustments and a lower-thanforecast cost of running our campus.



- In August, the **Stewardship Committee** began its annual discussion of ideas and goals for its fall campaign for next year.
- The Committee hopes to follow up on a successful campaign in fall 2019 that saw a record amount of funds pledged for supporting St. Paul's work and mission in Nantucket.
- You will be hearing more from us about this in the next few weeks.

#### MUSIC AT ST. PAUL'S

- Music Director Joe Hammer plans to continue providing instrumental and vocal music for weekly services and to explore interesting music topics for Music Monday, streamed on the church's Facebook page on Mondays at 8:30 PM.
- He is planning a live-streamed Holiday Stroll Variety Show, along with Advent and Christmas Eve music programs. Details to come.
- St. Paul's organ will be featured in the Nantucket Community Music Center's Holidays in Music: A Parade of Nantucket's Pipe Organs! – a 90-minute music program premiering on NCTV18 and social media streaming outlets on Friday evening, Nov. 27. The program will highlight Nantucket's six mechanical action instruments with performances of music of Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas and New Year's.
