Blue Christmas – A Service of Hope and Healing - December 14th at 7:00pm



- 3. As with contributions in respect of a 2016 pledge, so too must a prepayment of 2017 pledges be post-marked on or before December 31, 2016 for the prepayment to be deductible in 2016.
