Food Pantry/Rental Assistance Program Collections this Sunday

Our next collection for the Food Pantry will occur Sunday, May 7th, at both services. You are encouraged to bring a brown grocery bag containing your favorite non-perishable items that you would purchase for yourself. In

addition to food stuffs, needed items include those not eligible for food stamps –for example, laundry detergent, dish soap, shampoo and cleaning supplies

In addition to the collection of groceries, we will take up a special collection for the Nantucket Rental Assistance Program (NRAP). Both the Food Pantry and the NRAP are sponsored by the Nantucket Interfaith Council. A brochure describing the critical services the Food Pantry and NRAP provide on our Island will be available in the rear of the church on Sunday [and a copy is appended].

Please make your checks, intended for the Food Pantry or NRAP, payable to St. Paul's Church and place them in the special envelopes in the pews. If you place cash in the special envelope and if you write your name on the envelope, we will note your donation on the record we maintain of your contributions to StP. Absent a notation of "Food Pantry" on your check or envelope, we will credit your donation to NRAP.

Nantucket's Interfaith Council (IFC) is an unincorporated association of the Island's principal congregations, including prominently St. Paul's, St. Mary's, Summer Street, First Congregational, Unitarian, Methodist, Jewish, New Life Ministries and so on. The IFC's four major undertakings are the Food Pantry, NRAP, the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day celebration and the high school baccalaureate.

Choirs for Kids

Young voices add so much to our worship services, and singing is a wonderful way for young people to express themselves. St. Paul's provides at least two ways for children to sing in choral groups.

The Youth Choir

(ages 8 and up) sings challenging anthems, often with harmony, sometimes with handbells. They sing hymns from all three of our hymnals and have learned songs in other languages – Spanish, Hebrew and Zulu, to



name a few. There are also opportunities to sing solos. The Youth Choir rehearses on **Saturday** mornings from 10:00 to 10:45.

The **Church School Singers** (children who are in the church school program) learn fun and simple songs and sing occasionally during the 10:00 service, most often the Song of Praise before they go off to Sunday school. It is a time for them to learn about singing together in a group, processing into the church, listening to each other, and – the tricky one! – standing still. The skills they gain will prepare them for joining the Youth Choir when they are old enough. Older children are always welcome to join in with the littler ones. Rehearsals for the Church School Singers are **every other Saturday morning**, **10:45** – **11:15.** If there is enough interest, we may increase it to weekly rehearsals. The next one will be on May 6th.
